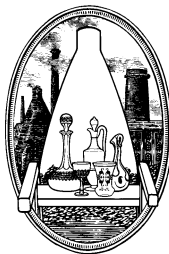

The collection, which has evolved over several years, covers pressed glass, commemoratives, older beer steins and Victorian drinking glasses.
