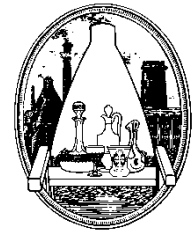


The Glass Association Members Section of the Web Site



The members section of the web site includes new features such as:

- Sharing of content including photos

- and more!

You could, for example, share a photo of a favourite glass object, post a query on the forum for other members to answer, share some interesting information, post details about a local event, etc.

You will need to sign in to use these features.

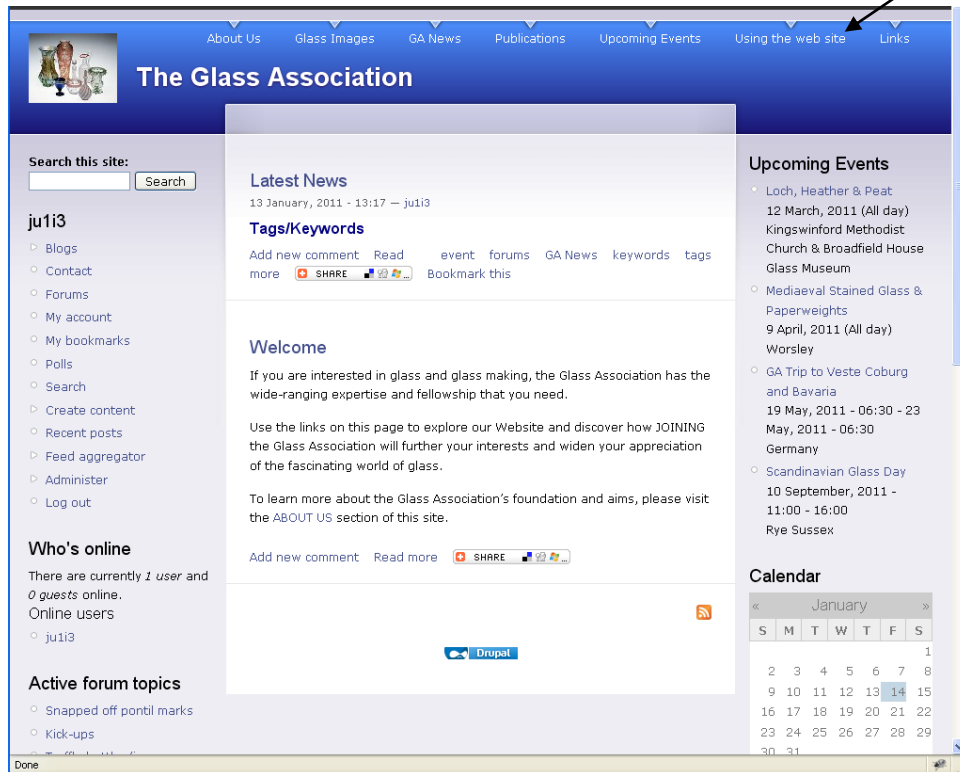
Go to www.theglassassociation.org.uk/drupal or go to www.theglassassociation.org.uk and click "Members" on the left menu bar or "Glass Association members" in the first line of the first paragraph.

Click "Create new account" if you have not signed in before. Enter your username and password if you have already created an account.

When you create a new account you will need to enter some basic details such as your name and email address and confirm that you are a member of the Glass Association. An Email will be sent to the membership

administrator for approval (to check that you are a member) and when approved an email will be sent to you with an initial password which must be changed at the first login. NB you must have an email address to use this web site.

Once you have logged in, more instructions can be found by clicking on "Using the web site" including this document where the links will be clickable.
